- District wellness committees are chaired by a member of the full school committee and will make recommendations regarding the district's health curriculum and instruction, physical education curriculum and instruction, and nutrition and physical activity policies to decrease obesity and enhance the health and well-being of students and employees.

6. Rose Molina, LICSW & Ana Berrou, Kindness Crew at JSEC Presented about Kindness Crew history and work. A core group of 16-18 students with an additional 15 or so participate in Kindness Crew endeavors at school and beyond. They were featured at this year's PVDFest. Rose shared a wonderful video showcasing their efforts (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-Qk0YKymxRk). She noted that they are trying to become a 501c3, and are working on developing a professional development session for other school staff who want to develop a similar initiative at their school. Discussion followed about Kindness Crew and connections with healthy relationships work, support of one another, and importance of student voice. A handout for additional information was provided.

Sara shared information on the Summer Learning Program/summer camps for families through the City of Providence and PPSD. All programs are free of cost and focus on enrichment. Sara also shared information on the Kidsbridge Summer Learning Program through Inspiring Minds, working with rising kindergartners and focusing efforts on preparing the students for the first year of school with an emphasis on SEL. Sara shared dates and times for Restorative Practices in Providence Public Schools sessions on June 18th and June 21st.

Krista shared the RICADV's new public awareness campaign focusing on the role men have to play in preventing domestic violence.

Rachel and Solight let Subcommittee know that PBS Newshour was in town this week filming a segment on the menstrual products project. Students were interviewed, including Subcommittee member Litzy Feliz. Once more information on the segment release is known, they will share with the Subcommittee.

Brittany mentioned a student from the Met who will be working on a campaign next school year trying to reduce the stigma of menstruation among the school community. The Subcommittee may want to partner with her efforts to develop a similar campaign in PPSD schools.
